As we look to the future, we are planning to gather Drive-In Style again for June 6. This means that those of you who are comfortable can bring lawn chairs to worship. You will be directed to enter the west parking lot and park your car on the gravel side. You can walk across the grass with your lawn chairs (or stay on the sidewalk in front of the church). There will be places marked for households to sit together properly distanced from other households. Masks are required. For those who are not comfortable in getting out of their car or physically are not able to walk that distance, you can tell the usher and there will still be Drive-In Style worship available. Cars will be parked a little further back in the parking lot. For those in cars, you will tune your radio to FM 89.1 and for those in chairs you will hear the service over speakers. In case of inclement weather, please watch our Facebook page and our website for cancellations.

It has been part of our tradition to have outdoor worship so we can enjoy God's creation. Outdoor worship is the safest way for us to gather as we are called to protect our most vulnerable members and visitors. On-line worship will continue at 9:30 on Facebook (you

can watch it on Facebook anytime after 9:30, too!) or on our website – stpaullutheranph.com under the "Worship Services" tab. Virtual Social Hour via Zoom will be at 9:15 on the Sundays we have Drive-In or Outdoor worship. I look forward to seeing everyone as we take safe steps in creating our new normal.

Book Discussion/Mini Retreat

For the last year and a half council has been doing book discussions as a part of their opening of the meeting. Last year we read and discussed, <u>The Church of Us vs Them</u> by David Fitch.

This year we are doing our book study on <u>Canoeing the Mountains</u> by Tod Botsinger. The book is based on the Lewis and Clark expedition and the transformational leadership required when they reached the mountains as canoes could no longer provide a means of transportation. As can be imagined, a brief discussion of fifteen minutes cannot do justice to two chapters of information and ideas.

On Saturday, May 22nd, a mini retreat was held to provide for deeper discussion and sharing.

We began with two thoughts for reflection:

I believe discipleship for me is... How can I grow my discipleship? These are great reflective questions for all of God's people.

We spent some time on what we valued for ourselves as individuals and shared values. A few of the shared values were: a church beyond/outside of the building, adaptive, collaborators and coconspirators in carrying out Christ's mission, and fellowship/sense of community.

The following four questions are tough for St. Paul, or any church, to ponder but must be answered if we are to move forward as a missional church:


- Why do we exist as a congregation, institution, or organization?
- What would be lost in our community, in our field, or in our world if we ceased to exist?
- What purposes and principles must we protect as central to our identity?
- What are we willing to let go of so the mission will continue?

Our final thoughts center around the DNA of St. Paul Lutheran Church. The DNA of a living organism is what makes it unique to itself.

What DNA of St. Paul is essential and must be preserved?
What DNA of St. Paul can be discarded?
What DNA of St. Paul needs to be created through experimentation?

As we move forward, we ask God's continued guidance and blessing in helping us to fulfill Christ's mission.

Synod Assembly

Due to Covid-19, Synod Assembly was held online this year in a one-day (6 hour) session on May 15. There were some technology challenges in the beginning of the day, but eventually they worked themselves out. We heard reports from the Bishop; Vice- President of the Synod, Paul Archer; Synod Secretary, Sonja Markwart; Nomination Committee, Pastor Joyce Partyka-Staib; the Synod Treasurer, Darrell Hurley; and the ELCA Treasurer, Lori Fedyk. We heard several mission moments from various organizations supported by Southeast Michigan Synod including Living Water Camp Ministry, Samaritas, Peace Not Walls, Trinity Lutheran Seminary, Lutheran Campus Ministry, Portico and Mission Investment Fund. We passed the Synod's Operating Budget and the Fund For Mission Budget. Elections for Synod Council and Churchwide Assembly in August 2022 were done. Pastor Bonnie was re-elected to serve on Synod Council from Conference 2. A complete list of the elections can be found on the Synod website. While the technology issues in the beginning were a challenge, in the end the business of the Synod happened. We are hopeful that Synod Assembly will happen in person in Port Huron next year.

Zoom Meetings without a computer-




