Drive-in Style worship in June will be June 6 and June 27



Bread for the World is a collective Christian voice urging our nation's decision makers to end hunger at home and abroad. Every year an Offering of Letters is collected to urge our legislators in Congress to pass legislation to feed our brothers and sisters domestically and globally. Supported with prayer, these letters are a bold witness to God's justice and mercy. Year after year, they impact the decisions made in Congress.

As Bread works with Congress to make further progress toward ending hunger, we are building on major victories in the American Rescue Plan. Domestically, Bread will focus on these priorities:

- 1. Make permanent the 15% increase in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- 2. Make permanent the nine-year summer food program (EBT) for children even when school is not in session
- 3. Make permanent the child tax credit which will lift millions of children out of poverty and help reduce racial inequality

We are writing letters and then mailing them directly to our members of Congress or emailing letters online to our Representative and both Senators with a single form. Called to be..., and called to do...

Sunday, April 11th was the second Sunday of Easter, and the gospel reading was from John 20:19-31. Bishop Donald Kreiss preached on this text, and one of the first things he spoke about was Jesus calling his disciples. As Bishop Kreiss said, and we know from scripture, Matthew 4:18-22, they left and immediately followed Him. We, too, are called to follow Jesus. We are not only called to be followers but we are called to do many things.

My favorite verse from the Gospel text, John 20:19-31, is verse 21. Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, so send I you."

Margaret Clarkson, a Canadian school teacher, wrote a song based on the text John 20:21 titled "So Send I You". This song was adapted in a volume titled Jesus Style Songs Vol. 1 by Augsburg Press in 1972.

I believe this version best expresses what we as disciples are called to do.

<u>So Send I You</u> E. Margaret Clarkson John W. Peterson

So send I you to labor unrewarded To serve unpaid, unloved, unsought, unknown, To bear rebuke, to suffer scorn and scoffing So send I you to toil for me alone. "As the father has sent me, So send I you."

So send I you to bind the bruised and broken, O'er wand'ring souls to work, to weep, to wake, To bear the burden of a world aweary So send I you to suffer for my sake. "As the Father has sent me, So send I you."

So send I you to loneliness and longing, With heart ahungering for the loved and known, Forsaking home and kindred, friend and dear one So send I you to know my love alone.

"As the Father has sent me, So send I you."

So send I you to leave your life's ambition, To die to dear desire, self-will resign To labor long and love where men revile you So send I you to lose your life in mine. "As the Father has sent me, So send I you."

So send I you to hearts made hard by hatred, To eyes made blind because they will not see, To spend though it be blood, to spend and spare not So send I you to taste of Calvary. "As the Father has sent me, So send I you."

The Thursday devotion for April 1st from Our Daily Bread spoke to what we are called to do also, "Everyone in our church family has been so helpful in taking care of during this time." 1 Peter 4:7-11

The worship for the second Sunday of Easter, April 11th, closed with the hymn ELW 798, "Will You Come and Follow Me," which calls us to follow and to do.

3rd Annual Virtual Mwen Walk Spring Fundraiser

Our goal is to invite new families to sponsor a school age child in Haiti and create a strong relationship between the US and Haiti. The Student Sponsorship program allow families to be involved directly with Living Hope Ministries. *Please follow us on Facebook and check the website regularly each week during May for video updates and additional information.*

- There are ~ 80 children in need of sponsorship
- Currently there are 192 sponsored students (mostly 1st-6th grade students)

Sponsorship involves 2 primary components:

- 1. Develop a personal relationship with your sponsored student as they become "part of your family."
 - Pray for your student
 - Send them photos of your family, pets, and activities
 - Send CARE packages as you are able (Christmas, Birthday, Start of School, etc.)
 - Receive yearly updates and thank you notes from your child
- 2. Financial support of \$40/month just \$1.33 per day!

Sponsorship Fund's support:

- On-going school operations which helps to support all students in primary school
- Teachers' salaries (60+ full & part-time staff)
- School supplies, text books, and testing materials
- Hot meal each day
