Jesus rested. He went aside to pray. He got tired. He felt feelings. Jesus was so in tune with his body and listening to what it needed.



COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS April 11, 2022 GATHER, GRACE, GROW, GO

Financial: Monthly **giving** has decreased year to date. Compared to our approved budget, the shortfalls have been approximately:

1% for January 2% for February

4% for March

Many factors contribute to ups and downs in monthly giving, so your council is not unduly concerned at this point. However, we will continue to monitor income and expenses so that we can stay within our 2022 budget.

Stewardship: The goal is to have a permanent rotating **monthly calendar** assembled for the June <u>Ray</u>. Remember to sign up on the sheets in the narthex for how you would most like to participate in Sunday services. We are looking forward to "**Thank You Sunday**" which will be May 15th. Many invitations have already gone out.

Property: Folks from Goodwill industries began **cleaning** the church on April 8th. If you are willing to train on the use of the Automatic External Defibrillator (**AED**), please contact Marcus Middleton. **Insurance** coverage for the shed in the east parking lot is being procured at minimal cost.

Parish Education: In-person **Sunday School** continues on May 8 and 22 from 9:45 to 10:45. **VBS** will be on August 1-5 from 5:30 to 7:30. A light dinner will be served to the students. Our theme is *Discovery on Adventure Island*. Throughout 2022 **Thrivent Choice Dollars** will be designated for VBS. The books clogging up the senior high youth room will soon become fodder for a **book sale**. Let Lisa Schleicher or Kathy Strauss know if you will help sort and display.

A new **Gift Policy** is in the works and an **Endowment Fund** is being created to ensure the discipleship and faithfulness of the congregations of St. Paul well into the future.
