We had a guest attend our meeting, Jacques Merkau.

Jacques was at the meeting to inform the council of the candidates of Congregational officers for council seats and committees.

The council made a motion and passed the Nominating Committee ballet for the election of officers for 2020. This will be voted on at the Nov 3rd Congregational meeting.

We talked about Read for Life program. This is a program for afternoon school literacy for youth at local schools. Signup sheets are on the table. Alex's Eagle Scout project is almost complete. The photo directory is up and running. Appointments are being taken now.

### **FOOD TRUCK REPORT 9/19/19**

A huge thank you to the 26 great volunteers who helped with the food truck. We had 115 families come to get food for 353 individuals. Twenty-two families came to a food truck for the first time and 70 families were over the age of 60. The excess food was donated to Harbor Impact for distribution to more people. There was 12,550 pounds of food on this food truck plus we donated 500 pounds of cabbage from the garden. Comparing this food truck to our 8/22/18 food truck which had 6,593 pounds of food that was distributed to 67 families, we did great all around.

This food truck was paid for with a \$900.00 grant that was made in memory of Mt. Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church which faithfully ministered to its members and to the community of Northeast Detroit for 73 years. It is an expression of the continuing ministry and faith of the former Mt. Zion Community.




