





Return to In-Sanctuary Services

As you know, the Building Re-opening Committee of St. Paul Lutheran Church was formed in June 2020 and has been diligently and faithfully meeting to monitor active COVID cases, vaccination rates in St. Clair County, and CDC guidelines. At the October 11th Council meeting, the Building Re-opening Committee presented a tentative re-opening date with guidelines for re-opening. The Council approved their recommendation and the tentative re-opening date has been set for Sunday, November 28th with services to be held at 8 AM and 10:30 AM.

This re-opening is wonderful news but please keep in mind the need for being respectful and responsible --- we've come so far and now is not the time to throw caution to the wind by not following the necessary preventive measures. Now is also the time to offer our sincere appreciation to each member of the Building Re-Opening Committee for their tireless efforts and for bringing us to this point---Thanks to: Linda Barker, Marcus Middleton, Laurie Morris, Cathy Steuwer, Chris Matts and Pastor Bonnie!

Let's follow the outlined preventive measures that protect the most vulnerable among our congregation, including our young children, the elderly and those with compromised immunities or underlying conditions, and the body of believers at St. Paul. We will continue to monitor our metrics and safety measures will be revisited as conditions change.

In order for a safe, successful, and smooth building reopening, we need everyone to do their part by kindly respecting these measures. We will need three ushers per service to facilitate physical distancing of family groups as well as volunteers for cleaning the seats, surfaces, and bathrooms.

Preventive Measures For In-Sanctuary Services:

1)Properly worn masks (covering nose and mouth) are required at all times to protect the most vulnerable among us. Those unwilling to comply will be asked to leave the building.

2)Upon entering the building, each member must complete a waiver form to hold harmless St. Paul Lutheran Church, its employees, agents and representatives, of and from all liabilities, claims, actions, damages, costs or expenses of any kind arising out of or relating to your participation in our worship services. This waiver will remain in effect through December 2022, at which time it will need to be updated as deemed necessary by our insurance company.

3)There will be a maximum of 34 people in the sanctuary with an additional seven (7) people in the Narthex. Maintain six (6) feet physical distance between family groups as assisted by the ushers.

4)Two worship services will be offered. <u>Pre-registration for worship will be required to achieve these limitations.</u>

Registrations will be taken in the order of call in. Please call 810-982-9853 by the Thursday prior to each service, stating your name, number of attendees and which service you want to attend. Please leave your phone number in case registrations exceed the limit per service.

5)No congregational singing will occur at this time. A soloist may be offered.

6)No coffee hour will be held at this time; fellowship will occur outside.

7)Communion bread and wine will be available at the back of the sanctuary to be picked up as you enter on Communion Sundays.

8)Offerings will be collected at the back of the sanctuary as you enter.

9)Attendees will **enter from the double doors,** filling the front rows first. Exiting will begin with the back rows first. The Pastor will maintain social distancing and not greet people following worship as in past.

10)Three (3) volunteers will be needed to usher at each service and three (3) volunteers will be needed after each service to wipe down chairs, bathrooms, doorknobs and other frequently touched items. Sign up by calling or emailing Karen Lee at 810-985-5539, 810-334-4478, or kalee4050@comcast.net

COMMUNITY GARDEN ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH 2021 Report



This was the thirteenth year for our Community Garden at St. Paul and it turned out to be our Third best year. This year our production was 10,330 pounds of produce that was donated to Mid City Nutrition, The Food Depot and S.O.S. in Marysville.

The Grand Total is 91,600 pounds since the garden was started in 2009.

We rented out 10'X10' plots for a deposit of \$10.00 per plot. If the gardener wanted more than 1 plot, they could have more. We rented out a total of 68 plots to a total of 20 gardeners. The \$10.00 nonrefundable deposit per plot will help pay the garden operating expenses. We also received a \$250.00 Thrivent Action Team grant to go toward the garden expenses. The gardeners were still responsible for taking care of their plot(s) and cleaning them up at the end of the season.

The Church's part of the garden was over ½ acre and we had a total of 28 great volunteers who helped with the garden this year. There were 18 members from St. Paul and 10 non-members who helped in the garden. Five were Master Gardeners. All help is greatly appreciated and I would like to give everyone who helped a big thank you. We can always use additional help next year. Please let me know if you would like to help.

We had a large assortment of garden produce consisting of green beans, lima beans, cabbage, cucumbers, eggplant, green peppers, potatoes, zucchini, yellow summer squash, acorn, butternut, hubbard, carrots, beets, sweet corn, tomatoes, broccoli and kale.

Every year we try some new things in the garden. This year we applied about 40 yards of composted cow manure and plowed it under. We used new plant spacings on the squash, cucumbers, cantaloupe, and watermelon which worked well. We used raised rows on some tomatoes, peppers, potatoes, corn and squash which worked out well for the second year. There were sunflowers for the bees. The weather was quite dry at the beginning of the season and then on about June 25th we had about 5" of rain with another 5" on about September 22nd. At this time the rain is slowing down the final cleanup, manure spreading and rye planting.
