

Volunteer Opportunities for Bold Women

- Love Day: Quilters meet at 9:00 on the 2rd and 4th Thursday each month to create quilts for Lutheran World Relief. The quilts are delivered each fall following the blessing at the Erntedankfest Worship. If you are unable to work on Thursdays, you can create quilt tops 60" X 80", donate fabric, twin size sheets (for the back), or batting. See Beth Radtke for more information.
- Heart Works / Prayer Shawl Ministry: Knit/Crochet and meet monthly on the 1st Tuesday to create items for those in need and also enjoy fellowship. For more information, contact Kathy Strauss. The current projects include:
 - Prayer Shawls, approximately 5 feet in length to be given to people experiencing challenge (you may knit/crochet or submit names of people in need),
 - Magic Hug Squares, 12 inch squares to wrap around Beanie Babies for children undergoing hospitalization, homelessness, etc.
 - Dresses for children in Haiti and other centers of need.
 Sew with us or donate supplies (7/8 yard of fabric, 3 yards of bias tape, and ½ yard of ½" elastic makes one dress). Have any unused fabric to recycle?.
 - Scarves, hats, & mittens to provide warmth for those in need during the winter months.
 - Fabric kits for LWR: a 3-yard piece of fabric and a spool of matching thread.
- Altar Guild: Prepare the sanctuary for worship & communion. Learn the symbolism and colors of the paraments. Select banners to enhance worship. Learn how to set up for communion and care for the vessels used.
- Prayer Chain Ministry: Join in praying for people with current needs and challenges. To become part of this ministry, contact Judy Halamka.
- Food Truck Ministry: Help sponsor the cost of the truck by donating \$ and/or work at the distribution. Lift hearts and fill hungry souls with your compassion. Talk to MaryAnn Meyers, for more information.

- Office Help: Assemble the newsletter for mailing. To volunteer, contact Diane Biskner.
- Sunday Morning Coffee Hour: Prepare coffee and treats, then clean up, load the dishwasher, and push the button. To add your name to the list of volunteers, call Kay Schnur.
- Worship Volunteers: Greet (come), read (grow), usher (serve), or assist with communion (nourish)). Contact Kay Schnur to volunteer.
- Sunday School: Teach, substitute, or help out. You can support this education financially, as well. For more information, call Nancy Thurston.
